

SUMMERLEAZE CLASS

In Summerleaze' English lessons, the students are engaging with Shakespeare's classic text, Romeo and Juliet and have started to watch Baz Luhrmann's iconic film featuring Leonardo DiCaprio and Claire Danes in the title roles. On a Monday, two students are working with the RSPCA on their second six-week placement learning how to care for a variety of sick or injured animals before returning them to the wild. Another student, who attends Footsteps, on a Monday participating in a wide range of outdoor activities including driving and campfire cooking, has just completed his welding module as part of an Engineering course undertaken at Cornwall College, Camborne, where he has made a metal model of a Star Wars X-Wing Fighter. Other Summerleaze students who are studying Media at Cornwall College on a Tuesday afternoon, have been learning to use media development and editing software which is helping them to develop their understanding and appreciation of career opportunities with IT.





VOTES FOR SCHOOLS

As a school, we have started to access Votes for Schools, which is a platform that highlights a weekly topic for students to consider and discuss. How do parents/families access this?

You can request a grocery bag through your child's tutor team or the family support team. Please see the email contacts below.

The family support team will then put together a grocery bag that can be sent home with the young person or given to the you if you collect your child from school.

Is there a limit on how often a family can request a grocery bag?

We want this to be a facility that all parents and carers can access and particularly in times of need. However, we have no way of telling how quickly supplies will last between the deliveries to school, so this will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

What will be included in the grocery bag?

Dried foods, tins, cereal/cereal bars, pasta, long life milk, cooking sauces etc and on occasions we will get toiletries. We cannot, however, accept requests, a grocery bag will be made up of a variety of the foods listed above.
